Designated as the official patriotic song of the United States: 1931

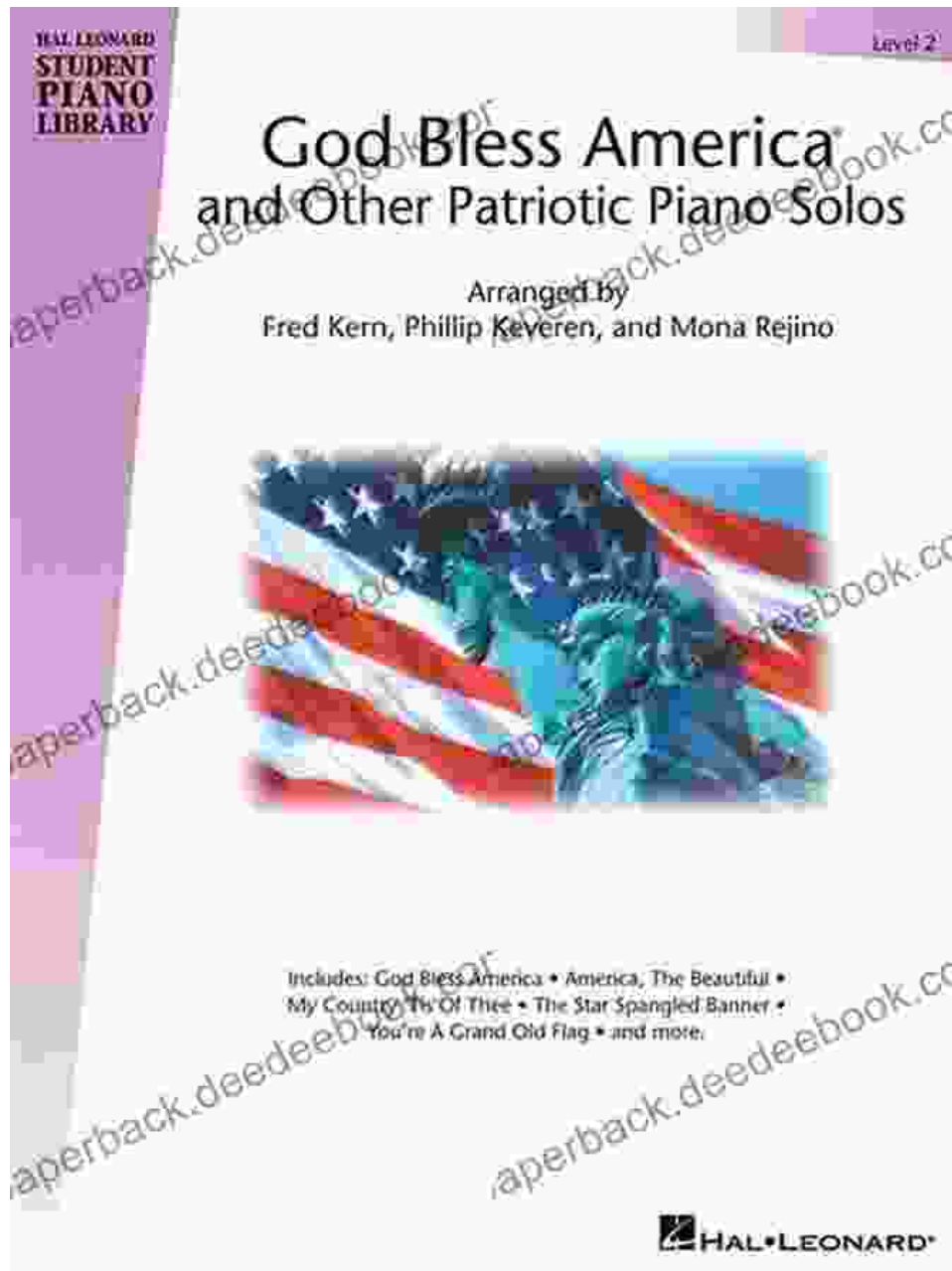
America the Beautiful is a breathtakingly patriotic song that celebrates the natural wonders and enduring spirit of the United States. Its lyrics,

Lyrics: Samuel Francis Smith

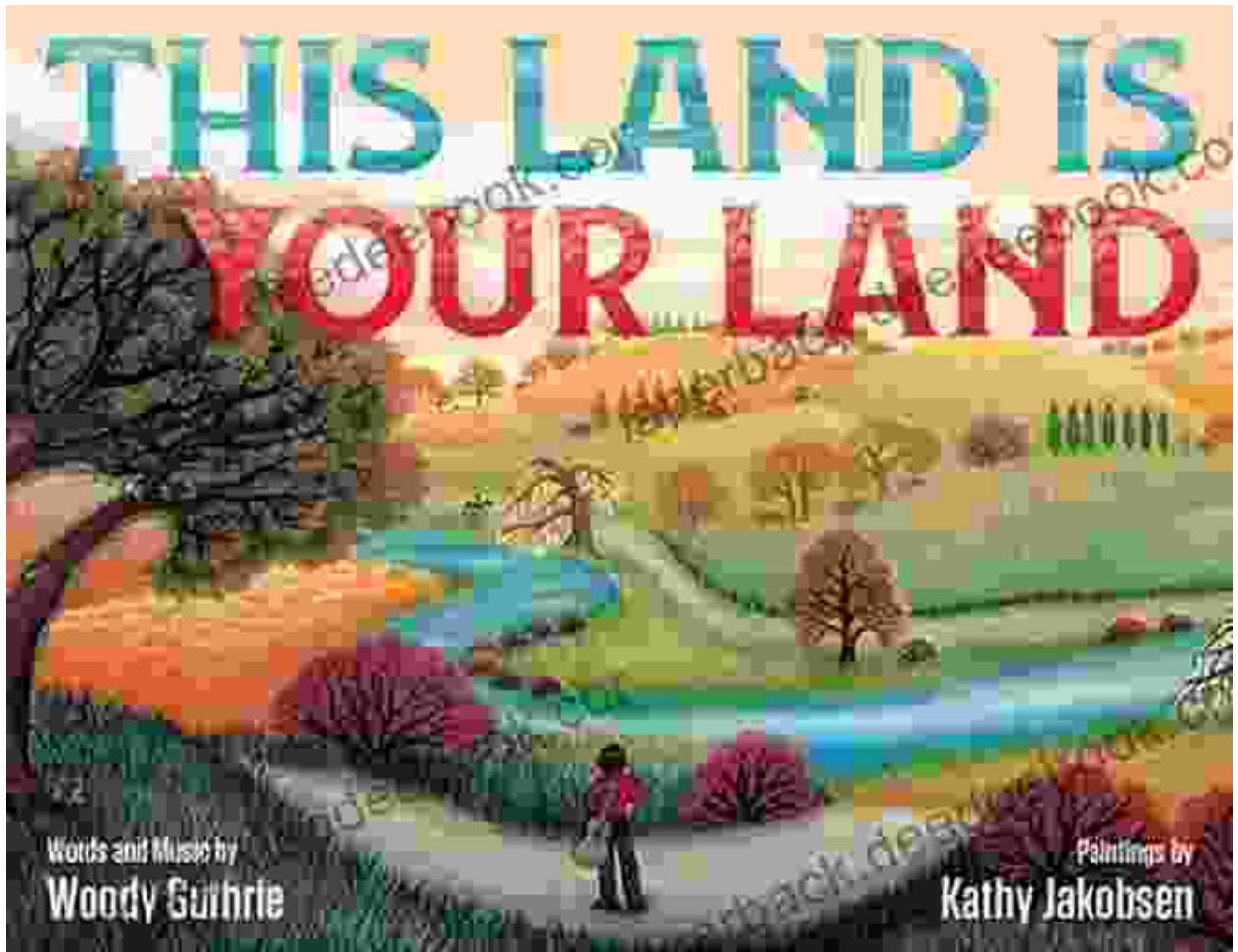

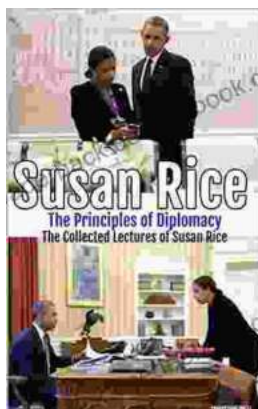

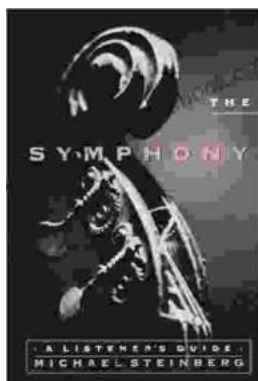
