

Jesse James: The Legendary Outlaw





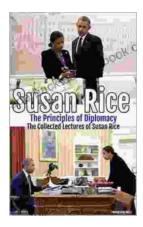
