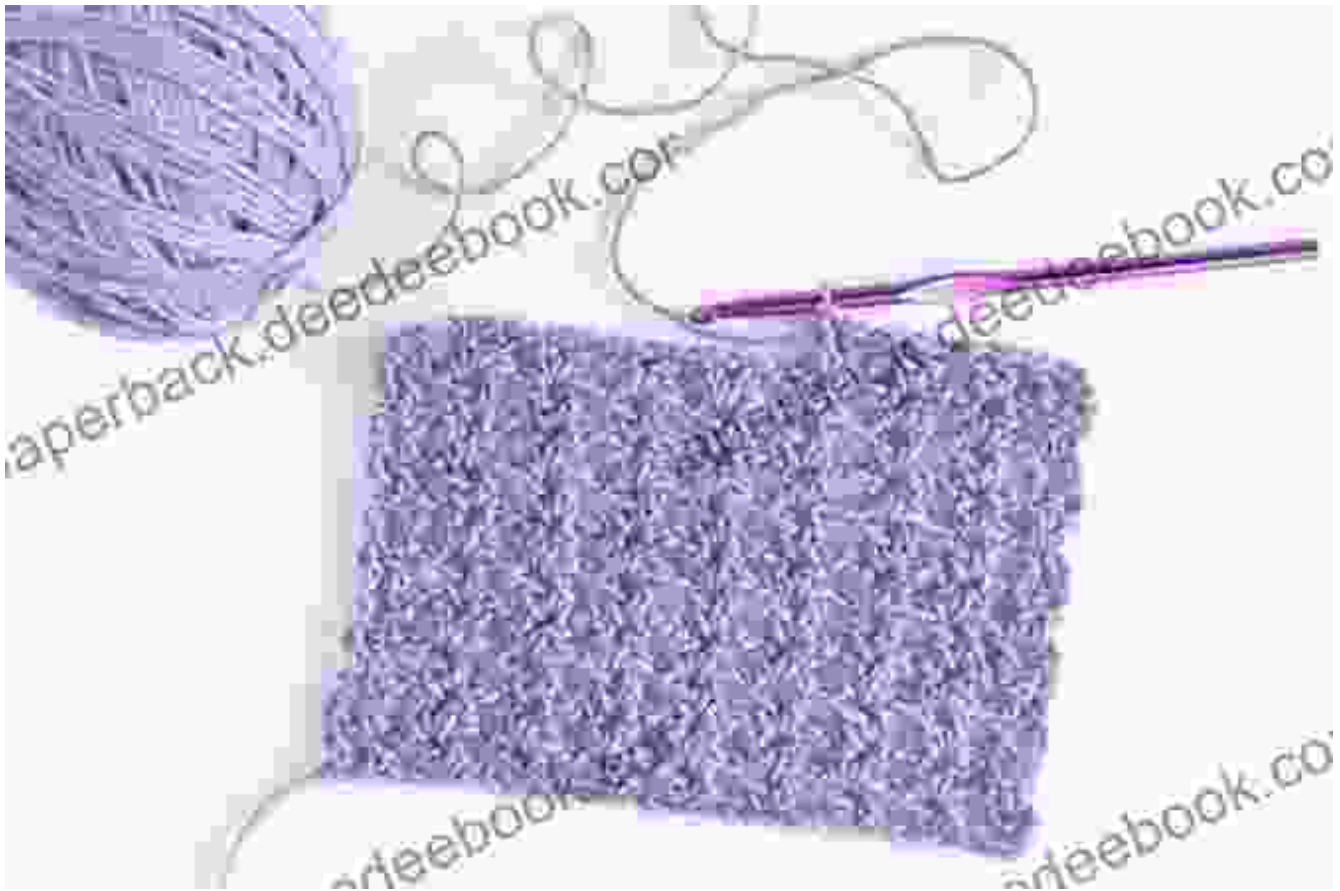
Basic Crochet Stitches

1. **Yo.** Bring the yarn over the hook and through the loop on the hook.
2. **Yo.** Bring the yarn over the hook again and through both loops on the hook.
3. **Yo.** Bring the yarn over the hook again and through the first two loops on the hook.

4. **Yo.** Bring the yarn over the hook again and through the remaining two loops on the hook.
5. **Repeat steps 2-4.** Continue yo and pulling through until you have the desired number of stitches.
