Materials

- 1 skein of worsted weight yarn
- Size 8 (5mm) knitting needles
- Yarn needle

Gauge

18 stitches and 24 rows = 4 inches in stockinette stitch

Finished Measurements

Approximately 6 inches wide by 8 inches tall

Instructions

1. Cast on 36 stitches.
2. Knit every row until the piece measures 8 inches from the cast-on edge.
3. Bind off all stitches.
4. Fold the piece in half, wrong sides together, and sew the sides together, leaving a 2-inch opening at the top for the Kindle to slip in.
5. Turn the cover right side out and weave in any loose ends.

Customization

This pattern can be easily customized to fit any size Kindle. To make a larger cover, simply cast on more stitches. To make a smaller cover, cast on fewer stitches. You can also adjust the length of the cover by knitting more or fewer rows.

You can also customize the look of the cover by using different colors of yarn or by adding embellishments such as beads or buttons.

Tips

- Be sure to use a yarn that is the correct weight for your knitting needles. If you use a yarn that is too thin, the fabric will be too loose and the cover will not fit snugly around the Kindle.

- If you are new to knitting, I recommend practicing on a swatch before starting the cover. This will help you get the hang of the stitches and ensure that you are knitting at the correct gauge.

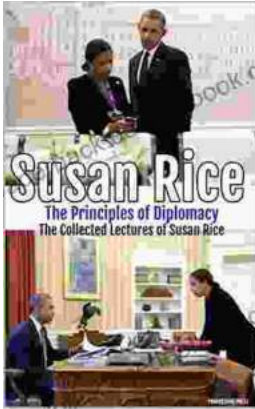


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
